Encompassing the Catholic philosophy, this new Chapel, under the direction of the Sisters of Providence and the Pastoral Care Team, will continue to provide pastoral and spiritual support services for our residents through daily Mass, Sunday Mass, Celebrations of the Major Feast Days and the Sacrament of the Sick.



Our Chapel – The Sacred Centre

- Be optimally designed, featuring natural light for illumination, stained glass, state-of-the-art technology and acoustics for those with hearing challenges.
- Reflect a place of community and a special space for people to gather.
- Have Stations of the Cross and other statuary and artifacts that reflect our Catholic heritage and identity.
- Celebrate daily Mass for approximately 120 people.
- The Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle.
- Be open to other religious groups to use for worship services.
- Be available 24 hours a day, seven days a week for reflection, prayer, meditation and private contemplation for residents, family members, staff and volunteers.
- Accessible to all.
