Dining Room Rejuvenation

Funds Required: \$50,000

FURNITURE AND TELEVISION ADDITIONS:

The sunrooms at Providence Care Centre are a space where residents can relax, socialize, and enjoy the natural light. Unfortunately, they lack the comfort and warmth of a traditional living room. Our team at Providence has identified that by adding a fireplace, TV stand and a 50-inch television to each of these sunrooms, would create a more enjoyable and welcoming environment for our residents. It would also provide warmth and comfort for residents during colder months as the fireplace will create a cozy atmosphere and promote a feeling of home. The 50-inch television will allow residents to enjoy their favorite shows and movies together, providing a sense of community and socialization.



We are committed to improving the quality of life for their residents, and this initiative is a reflection of that commitment. The addition of these amenities will not only enhance the comfort and enjoyment of the residents, but will also promote a positive and welcoming atmosphere for families and visitors.

REPLACEMENT:

Resident Room Blinds

Continuing care centres are an essential part of our healthcare system, providing care and support for seniors and those with chronic medical conditions. We strive to create a comfortable and homely environment for their residents, but sometimes, the design of the facility can feel clinical and impersonal. One way to combat this is by replacing traditional Venetian blinds with sheers and room darkening curtains. Venetian blinds are often used in long term care facilities because they are effective at controlling light and privacy. However, they can make a room feel cold and sterile, which can be unsettling for residents. Additionally, Venetian blinds can be difficult to clean and maintain, which can lead to hygiene issues. On the other hand, sheers and room darkening

curtains are more versatile in terms of design and functionality. Sheers can allow natural light to flow through, creating a bright and welcoming atmosphere for residents. They are available in a range of colors and patterns, making them a great option for adding a touch of personality to resident rooms. Room darkening curtains, on the other hand, are perfect for those who require complete darkness when they sleep or rest. They can also provide insulation and reduce noise levels, making them a practical choice for long term care facilities.

Sheers and room darkening curtains are also easier to clean and maintain than Venetian blinds. They can be machine washed or spot cleaned, which can help to prevent hygiene issues in resident rooms. Replacing Venetian blinds with sheers and room darkening curtains can help to create a more homely and comfortable environment.

In December 2022, we made the initial request for \$180,000 which is required for these blind replacements. *To date we have reached half of our goal so we are still in need of: \$90,000.*
